### PASTOR'S CORNER...

**BIRTHDAYS/ANNIVERSARIES FOR BUILDING FUNDRAISER** The Bunkertown Church decided to not begin to excavate and build our new storage building until half of the approximately \$140,000 is raised to build the much needed facility. As of December 17th, 2024, \$33,839.70 is in the Building Fund which means approximately \$36,000 more is needed to be raised until excavation and building would begin on the new storage building to be located behind the church.


